Its no longer just a mans game and its great spending time together

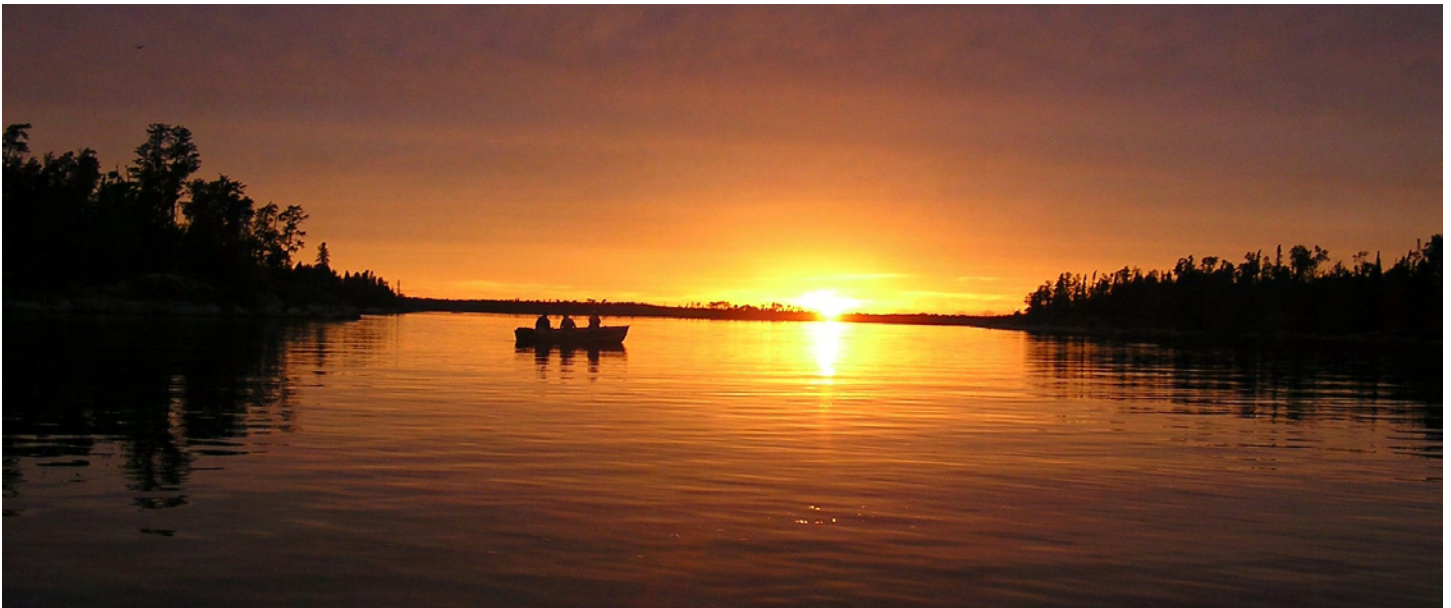
This fall Kasey, Ashley and I took a Possession Acquisition License and Hunting course.
